New York State's Adirondack Park: A 10,000 square mile "island" in the densely populated Northeast, greater in size than Yellowstone, Yosemite, Glacier and Grand Canyon National Parks combined...and home to some of the best biking in the East.

A new website produced by the Adirondack North Country Association makes it easy to find the preferred routes, rides and trails in New York State's 15 Northern Counties.

www.BikettheByways.org features 120 road rides, bike paths and mountain bike trails, organized by ability levels to ensure something for every rider. The central theme for the site is the area's 15 Scenic Byways - which are some of the major roads into the Adirondack region - offering spectacular scenery and great opportunities for bicycling.

Here are some of the other highlights:

SEARCH BY BYWAYS:

The Byways vary in length from 17 to 190 miles, and each offers a unique set of scenic, historic, cultural and recreational resources. For those familiar with the Scenic Byways, a tab at the top of the page has a drop-down menu that reveals each route, along with specific segments along each Byway.

MANY MAPS:

For ease in navigation, nearly 50 Google maps embedded in the site makes it easy to locate the routes.

Get oriented with the Regional Byway Map, where the list of Byways names can be clicked to see a Byway's location on the map. Then click the map to go to that Byway's overview page and learn more about its bicycling opportunities.

FIND A BIKE SHOP: The site lists 44 shops across the region, complete with location, contact information and links to websites.

BROWSE BY TOPIC: Tabs across the top of the page organize the features by topic, including mountain biking and road rides, bike paths, bike shops and guide books & maps - with links to online bicycling information for specific areas within the region.
